Neurodevelopmental disabilities specialists possess extensive knowledge in basic sciences, pathology, clinical evaluation, diagnosis, and management of these disorders beyond the level of a general child neurologist. Their expertise allows them to provide comprehensive and integrated care to both children and adults with neurodevelopmental disabilities. The purpose of the program is to prepare the physician for independent practice as a neurodevelopmental disabilities specialist. The program must combine education in the relevant basic sciences with supervised clinical education in the comprehensive and integrated diagnosis and care of children with neurodevelopmental disabilities across the life spectrum.
