The RRC is requesting nominations for their next Resident Member.

If you would like to recommend one of your residents, nominations should be submitted (by mail, e-mail, or fax) by **September 14, 2008**, and must include:

1. Your letter of recommendation, which must confirm that you will provide the resident time away from your program to attend an orientation session, two RRC meetings per year, and two Council of Review Committee Residents meetings per year.
2. The resident's personal statement, outlining educational goals, professional interests, and intent to serve if elected to the Committee; and
3. An up-to-date copy of the resident's CV.

The RRC will review nominations during its September 14 meeting. Program directors who submit nominations will be notified of the Committee's selection following that meeting.

#### **Qualifications of the RRC Resident Member:**

1. The nominee must be a PGY-1 or PGY-2 in an ACGME-accredited Pathology residency program during the current academic year.
2. The nominee must be able to attend RRC Orientation in Chicago on March 20, 2009, as well as the RRC meeting in Santa Fe on April 17-18, 2009 (as an observer).
3. The nominee must be able to serve on the RRC from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2011. Typically, the RRC meets twice a year—one weekend in April and one weekend in October. (Dates and locations beyond April 2009 have not yet been scheduled.)
4. The nominee cannot be from the same institution as any member of the RRC.

#### **Responsibilities of the RRC Resident member:**

The Resident Member will participate as a full voting member in all RRC activities, including program review and policy discussion. The Resident Member would be subject to the same confidentiality, conflict of interest, and fiduciary responsibility policies that the other members follow.

Also, the RRC Resident Member is expected to participate on the Council of Review Committee Residents (CRCR), comprising the Resident Members of every ACGME Review Committee. The CRCR meets in Chicago twice a year—once in February and once in September.
