

Justification/Impact Statement
Proposed Revisions to the Program Requirements for
Child and Adolescent Psychiatry

1. Impact on resident education

How will the proposed changes improve the quality of resident education?

The Psychiatry Committee anticipates that the proposed revisions will improve the quality of resident education on the basis of the following:

- a. The length and purpose of resident rotations are more clearly defined;
- b. Didactic and clinical training standards are organized under each of the six ACGME competencies; and,
- c. Requirements for resident, faculty, and program evaluation are designed to identify opportunities to improve educational program outcomes (e.g., assessment of resident competencies, program goals, and faculty teaching).

Although no increase in number of faculty is anticipated, the proposed change more explicitly defines the qualifications for departments of psychiatry. This clarification affirms that Department Chairs must be appropriately qualified physicians. Any program with a non-physician as Department Chair will need to make appropriate change which may entail an added resource cost.
