What skills should members of the interprofessional caregiver team have?  <i>[Program Requirement: VI.E.2.]</i>	All members of the interprofessional caregiver team should be provided instruction in: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. communication, so that if all required tasks cannot be accomplished in a timely fashion, appropriate methods are established to hand off the remaining task(s) to another team member at the end of a clinical experience and education period;</li> <li>2. compliance with clinical and educational work hours limits imposed at the various levels of education;</li> <li>3. prioritization of tasks as the dynamics of a patient's needs change;</li> <li>4. recognition of and sensitivity to the experience and competency of other team members;</li> <li>5. recognizing when an individual becomes overburdened with responsibilities that cannot be accomplished within an allotted time period;</li> <li>6. signs and symptoms of fatigue not only in oneself, but in other team members;</li> <li>7. team development; and,</li> <li>8. time management.</li> </ol>
