GENERAL PROGRAM INFORMATION

The ACGME is pleased once again to host the longstanding and successful annual Leadership Skills Training Programs. Three program dates are designed exclusively for pediatric chief residents, and five program dates are for rising chiefs from all medical and surgical specialties.

The experiential workshops consist of small-group sessions and exercises offering incoming chief residents the tools, skills, and learning environment to enhance their understanding of interpersonal communication and group dynamics, including skills critical to success and satisfaction as both a clinician and leader. *All programs are three days in length.*

REGISTRATION

Registration is limited to 50 residents per session, and must be completed online with payment. The registration fee is \$1,015, and includes breakfast and lunch for each conference day; a Welcome Reception on the first conference day; and a syllabus and all workshop materials. **Credit card payment is preferred** and registration confirmation will be sent via e-mail immediately upon submission of payment. Registration submitted with payment by check will remain pending until payment is received by the ACGME.

NOTE: Pending registrations will be cancelled if payment is not received by the registration deadline.

DO NOT MAKE TRAVEL OR HOTEL RESERVATIONS WITHOUT CONFIRMATION OF ACCEPTANCE

Cancellation and Refund Policies

A full refund will be given until 30 days prior to the program date. Cancellations requested less than 30 days before a scheduled workshop will incur a \$125 administrative fee. **No refunds will be made for cancellations made seven days or less before a workshop**. If the ACGME needs to cancel a program, registrants will receive a full refund of their registration fee. No refund for airfare or hotel will be provided by the ACGME.

ACGME FACULTY

Maureen G. Leffler, DO, MPH

Scholar for Experiential Learning and Leadership Development ACGME Department of Education Course Director – Leadership Skills Training Program for Chief Residents

Maureen G. Leffler, DO, MPH, more commonly known as "Mo," first began working with Robert Doughty, MD, PhD during her pediatric chief residency. Dr. Doughty designed and facilitated seminars to enhance leadership and management skills for future medical leaders, and is nationally recognized for his pioneering work in the development of experiential workshops for pediatric residents and chief residents. Inspired by her own experience at the Leadership Skills Training Program for Chief Residents, Dr. Leffler subsequently worked with Dr. Doughty to design and facilitate a leadership curriculum for both pediatric and medicine residents. In the years following her residency, she has continued to implement this curriculum at multiple institutions. In addition to facilitating resident-oriented workshops, she continued to work with the ACGME, refining her facilitation skills while training chief residents in medical and surgical subspecialties. In 2016 she officially joined the ACGME as Scholar for Experiential Learning and Leadership Development.

Dr. Leffler completed her medical training at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine, and her residency in pediatrics at Nemours/Thomas Jefferson University, where she also served as Chief Resident. She subspecialized in rheumatology, completing her fellowship at Nemours/Thomas Jefferson University, and currently practices pediatric rheumatology at Nemours/AI DuPont Hospital for Children.

Timothy P. Brigham, MDiv, PhD

Chief of Staff, ACGME Senior Vice President, Department of Education, ACGME

As head of the Department of Education, Dr. Brigham's responsibilities include the ACGME's Annual Educational Conference and development and oversight of educational programs for the organization. Prior to joining the ACGME in 2008, Dr. Brigham served since 1989 in several capacities at Jefferson Medical College, including as associate dean for graduate medical education and continuing medical education, senior associate dean for organizational development, chief of staff, and associate professor of medicine. Dr. Brigham has been involved in physician faculty development, resident education, and chief resident and program director development. He is widely sought after as a teacher, speaker, group facilitator, and consultant in a variety of areas, including resident stress and well-being; chief resident, program director, and chair personal leadership development; medical student, resident, and faculty teaching development; and group and team organizational development. Dr. Brigham holds a PhD in psychological studies in education from Temple University, a master's degree in counseling and human relations from Villanova University, and a master's of divinity from Palmer Theological Seminary.
