


Entering Scholarly Activity

This document contains examples of common scholarly activity entry errors. The first example highlights errors commonly seen when entering information into the Accreditation Data System (ADS). The second example highlights errors commonly found when faculty members' CVs are entered into ADS. This handout can be used as a reference by faculty members when updating CVs and entering scholarly activity.

Faculty Scholarly Activity Template

- · Provide the information
- If there are no activities in a particular column, say so do not leave blank
- · Note the information is for ONE YEAR
